Campus Highlights: FMI, Yap Campus, and National Campus

FMI and Yap Campus Recruiting Faculty, Staff, and Learners

Recruitment process is still ongoing for these vacancies: Instructional Coordinator, Librarian I, Education Instructor, English Instructor. At present, there are 5 full time faculty members (Soc Sci, Science, EET, Math, English) and two ACE Mentors. Background checks are now being done for the English Instructor candidate, while librarian I position is now being announced.

Team traveled to Chuuk, Pohnpei, and Kosrae to recruit new students and promote Class 4. They had the opportunity to meet with NFC, NORMA, FSM TC&I, and FSM Vital, among others, to share program information and to solicit employment opportunities for our graduates.

Course Outline Approval

All course outlines for Class 5 courses have been approved by both the COM-FSM Curriculum Committee and TC&I, and are expected to be offered starting August 2025.

NORMA Observers Training

NORMA- FMI will host the NORMA Observers Training to run for 8 weeks, June 11 – August 13th for 10 trainees. Four Trainers from NORMA will conduct the training with FMI instructors to assist with courses in Basic Sea Survival, Firefighting, First Aid at Sea, and Personal Safety & Social Responsibility. The training cost is \$30,510, which includes instruction, training materials/supplies, room and board, fees, refreshments, and ground transportation.

Celebrating Success

The 9th Joint Commencement Exercises for Yap Campus & FSM FMI was held on May 20, 2025, with 13 cadets graduating. Nine received the following certificates: Certificate of Completion in Basic Safety, Certificate of Completion-Watchkeeping Rating (Deck), Certificate of Achievement, Navigation (Class 6 Master), With Fishing Technology courses, and Advanced Certificate of Achievement, Navigation (Class 5 Master).

Four received the following: Certificate of Completion in Basic Safety, Certificate of Completion-Watchkeeping Rating (Engine), Certificate of Achievement, Marine

Engineering (Class 6 Engineer), With Fishing Technology courses, and Advanced Certificate of Achievement, Marine Engineering (Class 5 Engineer).

Yap campus students also completed their degrees and certificates in the following programs: BS in Elementary Education, AA in Liberal Arts and Pre-Teacher Preparation, and CA in Agriculture & Food Technology and Nursing Assistant.

Notable attendees of the commencement exercise was TH Aren B. Palik, Vice President of the FSM, who was their keynote speaker, and TH Robson Romoluw, Vice Speaker of the FSM Congress.





National Campus

Moodle Training

Moodle LMS training continues after Spring 2025 graduation. There is the Basics Moodle training session and then there's the Advanced Moodle training session.

By the end of the Prep & Practice: Moodle Basic Training workshop, participants will be able to navigate the Moodle Interface to access and manage course settings, create basic Moodle course topics and appropriate settings, upload and organize content in the Moodle course, implement basic Moodle resources, apply best practices for course visibility and student access, and demonstrate readiness to use Moodle in teaching

By the end of the Prep & Practice: Moodle Advanced Training workshop, participants will be able to customize the Moodle gradebook to support assessment strategies, implement conditional activities to personalize student learning paths, manage student groups to facilitate collaborative learning, and apply advanced tools to ensure course functionality.

The Learning Design team is finalizing workshop bookings for June and July, with scheduling open for changes. The workshop will use a flipped classroom model, and Instructional Coordinators (ICs) should inform and share the plan with all participating instructors.

Program Modification

CIS Program Modification request gained endorsement for approval during CC's meeting of May 21, 2025.

Summer Offerings

54 courses (69 sections) are schedule for Summer 2025.

IQBE Program Progress

IQBE is training the first educational technologist to assist faculty in transitioning from Canvas to Moodle and developing a blended learning training packet. The pilot blended learning session took place in Yap, with another scheduled for the first week of June in Pohnpei. Lead teacher training for all states is ongoing, along with professional development for PDOE lead teachers from Nett, Kolonia, and Madolenihmw.

Challenges

- Setting training dates with each SDOE as each state has their own set of dates and objectives. (Experienced in previous quarters as well).
- Delay in training and COM-FSM IQBE activities due to low funding.

Recommendations

 A well-organized calendar of training activities is required for each state, along with timely responses from the TC and project managers in every state.

IA: In Action - Collaborating with Stakeholders

Accounting Technician DOFA/WB

The Federated States of Micronesia (FSM) faces a shortage of local accounting talent, often relying on foreign consultants. To address this, the Financial Management Umbrella Program (FMUP) partnered with the College of Micronesia-FSM (COM-FSM) to develop a competencybased accounting curriculum - The Accounting Technician Program.

The first class started in January 2025 with 30 government employees (20 women and 10 men). Students study on the main campus or online from other islands. The program aims to train more homegrown talent and improve career opportunities.

Now, it is continuing to Summer 2025 with 30 students (17 DOFA and 13 BSBAA students).

UNOPS End-of-Life Vehicle Project

COM-FSM in partnership with UNOPS collaborating on a project that uses GIS mapping to identify End of Life Vehicles in the FSM.

Illegal Dumping Sites

While not yet systematically cataloged, several instances of tires, batteries, and vehicles dumping were observed during field visits especially in the main town around the repair shops. These are being tracked informally and will be integrated into GIS layers as data verification progresses.

Potential Dumping Grounds

Students were introduced to basic site assessment practices to identify and flag potential dumping areas based on environmental and logistical risks. This activity will be further developed in later project stages.





Methodology and Implementation

Fieldwork

- **Tools**: GPS devices, ArcGIS Pro, tablets for real-time data entry.
- Teams: 28 members (13 females), including faculty and
- Approach: Prioritized urban/rural zones; outer islands accessed via chartered boats.

Early Childhood Education Training

From May 13-18, 2025, a significant meeting was held in Yap State, organized by the College of Micronesia-FSM, FSM National Department of Education, and UNICEF. Led by Professor Pearl Olter-Pelep and Mr. Herry Wichep, the initiative focused on developing an Inclusive Early Childhood Education (ECE) Teacher Training program.

Before the important fourday meeting, Prof. Pearl Olter-Pelep, Mr. Herry

Wichep, and I visited the Yap Director of Education. During this meeting, Mrs. Pearl briefed the Director on the project's expected outcomes.

The Director's enthusiastic support validated the project's relevance and fostered collaboration essential for developing the ECE Teacher Training Plan and implementing the Yap Teacher Training Plan. This productive exchange with the Yap Director of Education was a vital first step in the engagement.

The groundwork was established for a positive working relationship essential for addressing future project challenges and opportunities. A training session was also conducted in Yap with 18 participants.

Future plans involve training sessions for ECE and Special Education teachers in Pohnpei from July 14-18, 2025. The COM-FSM team will create training modules focused on Early Childhood Education, Inclusive learning, and Indigenous learning. A survey will also be conducted to gather insights from teachers to inform the development of these modules.

We have a workshop scheduled for June 5 & 6, 2025, for 35 Pohnpei state ECE and Special Education Teachers, and we kindly request to reserve the COM-FSM gym on those dates.

Preceptor Training

The College of Micronesia-FSM Division of Health Sciences, in partnership with AHEC, will hold a Preceptor Training from June 3-5, 2025. The program aims to enhance nurses' mentorship and leadership skills, helping them support newly graduated nurses and nursing students in their transition to clinical practice. Participation is limited to 10-12 individuals.

The training is structured into six comprehensive modules, each designed to equip participants with essential skills for effective preceptorship:

- Introduction to Preceptorship Understanding the role and significance of preceptors in nursing education.
- The Effective Preceptor Key attributes and best practices for successful mentorship.
- The Art of Feedback Techniques for Providing Constructive and Meaningful Feedback.
- Avoiding Problems Strategies for Recognizing and Addressing Potential Challenges.
- Surviving Difficult Situations Managing complex interactions with professionalism and confidence.
- Meaningful Evaluations Assessing progress and fostering continued growth.

By participating in this training, nurses will improve their mentoring skills and support for peers, boosting confidence in professional values. This initiative promotes lifelong learning, preparing healthcare professionals for the evolving demands of their field.
