

### Facilities & Maintenance Division Report August – November 2025

Featuring the New Student Center Construction - COM-FSM

Prepared for the December 2025 Board of Regents Meeting

#### 1. Overview

This report highlights key improvements, maintenance achievements, renovation activities, and infrastructure project updates completed by the Facilities & Maintenance Division from August to November 2025.

### 2. Enhancements to Operations & Services

- Preventive maintenance (PM):
- Vehicle PM: 40% of Level A completed; Level B: 2 units.
- Recruitment of three special contract staff for grounds, AC/electrical, and building repair.
- Shuttle bus inspection and repair completed; ridership revenue doubled.
- A total of 109 bus passes were purchased for Fall 2025, generating \$8,720 in revenue.

In comparison, 113 passes were purchased in Fall 2024 for \$4,520. Despite a slight decrease in passes sold, revenue doubled, indicating strong and sustained demand.

• Faulty 3-phase power meter at Kosrae replaced after joint monitoring.

### 3. Residence Halls Upgrades

• New water tanks and pumps installed for male and female halls.



• Dormitory refurbishments include:

- Floor cleaning & waxing
- Window screen replacements
- Ceiling fans replaced
- Painting
- Furniture repairs
- Furniture procurement (bunkbeds, lockers, tables) pending funds.

## 4. ACIP-Linked Improvements & Progress Indicators

- 40% completion of vehicle & equipment PM for Oct-Nov.
- Water use monitoring implemented monthly.
- Kosrae Multi-Purpose Building delayed due to contractor bonding requirement.
- Four IMF Projects now out for bidding (closing Dec 10, 2025).
- FMI dorms/classrooms & New Student Center expected completion December.

### 5. Challenges & Recommendations

- Infrastructure project delays due to limited institutional capacity.
- PM Program effectiveness hindered by lack of data tracking.
- Recommendation: Strengthen project management & implement PM data system.

### 6. Ongoing Work

- Generator repairs for dorms, dining hall, bookstore & dispensary.
- New generator installation for classrooms/faculty/clinic.

- Continued water monitoring and leak detection.
- Roof painting for Buildings A and B.

### 7. Planned Next Steps (Dec 2025 - Jan 2026)

- Reinstate PM program for facilities & AC systems by January 2026.
- Develop PM data collection & monitoring system.
- Renovation of Building J (former Nursing Center).

# Procurement & Property Management Office Report August - November 2025

### 1. PPMO Highlights & Mission

The Procurement & Property Management Office (PPMO) continues to enhance procurement efficiency, vendor compliance, and property oversight. Our mission focuses on transparency, compliance, stewardship, and cost-effective operations.

### 2. Procurement Updates

• RFQ 2025-05 – Server for Yap Campus: Recommendation approved by VPIS.

- RFP 2026-01 Landscaping, Grounds Maintenance & Waste Disposal (CTEC): Evaluation ongoing.
- CT-0452 FMI Laptops & Bags: Delivered Nov 3, 2025.
- CT25-0471 35 Desktops for Yap: Delivered Nov 3, 2025.
- VPIS placed a hold on PR/POs for Pohnpei Ace company and braches to review and clear long-standing balances
- Consolidation planning with Dateline Exports for container-based procurement.
- Oct 21–31: PPMO led 2025 Fixed-Asset Year-End Inventory.

### 3. Kosrae Electrical Billing Investigation

Abnormally high July–September 2025 electricity bills triggered investigation:

• July: \$15,607.30

• August: \$16,157.63

• September: \$19,248.92

PPMO coordinated with Maintenance, Kosrae Campus, and Fiscal Office.

Preliminary findings suggest overbilling or meter malfunction; audit pending.

Reconciliation with KUA will follow audit results.

### 4. Property Management Updates

- Installed designated traffic signage for student transport.
- Monthly National Campus vehicle inspection program active.



• Ongoing review of used assets such as desks and furniture to reduce procurement costs.

### **5. Electrical Consumption Monitoring**

Kosrae Campus billing remains under scrutiny pending electrical audit results. PPMO will coordinate corrective actions after reconciliation with KUA.

### 6. PPMO Commitment & Outlook

PPMO remains committed to cost savings, efficient procurement processes, vendor accountability, and strengthened asset management across all campuses.
