RESOLUTION NO. 2026.2

A Resolution Directing the Development and Implementation of a Fuel Supply Response Plan to Ensure Continuity of College Operation

WHEREAS, the College of Micronesia-FSM depends on reliable fuel supply to sustain essential functions, including transportation, facilities operations, utilities support, and delivery of academic and student services; and

WHEREAS, ongoing uncertainties in fuel availability within the Federated States of Micronesia present potential risks to institutional continuity, safety, and service delivery; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Regents has a fiduciary responsibility to ensure that the College is prepared to respond effectively to operational disruptions and external risks; and

WHEREAS, proactive planning and coordinated response strategies are necessary to mitigate the impacts of fuel supply disruptions and ensure efficient use of institutional resources;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. Development of a Fuel Response Plan

The Board directs the President to develop and implement a comprehensive Fuel Supply Response Plan for the College.

2. Scope of the Plan

The Plan shall include, at a minimum:

- Assessment of current fuel usage, storage capacity, and critical operational needs
- Identification of essential vs. non-essential services during fuel shortages
- Contingency strategies for prioritization and rationing of fuel
- Alternative supply arrangements and vendor diversification strategies

- Operational adjustments (e.g., reduced services, scheduling modifications, remote delivery options where appropriate)
- Risk mitigation measures to address cost volatility and supply disruptions

3. Procurement and Compliance Alignment

The Plan shall ensure that all procurement actions remain aligned with Board Policy No. 5301 and applicable federal regulations (including 2 CFR 200), while identifying circumstances under which emergency procedures may be invoked.

4. Coordination and Implementation

The President shall designate appropriate administrative units, including Facilities, Procurement, and the Business Office, to coordinate implementation of the Plan across all campuses and sites.

5. Timeline

An initial Fuel Supply Response Plan shall be submitted to the Board of Regents within 30 days of adoption of this resolution.

6. Reporting and Updates

The President shall provide periodic updates to the Board on:

- Implementation status of the Plan
- Fuel supply conditions
- Operational impacts and mitigation actions

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board affirms its commitment to ensuring institutional resilience and continuity of operations in the face of external disruptions affecting the College and the communities it serves.
