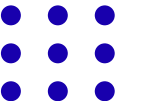

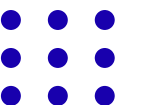

After the award ceremony, the students all came together to celebrate their hard works throughout the school year. They enjoyed eating ice cream and bread along with pizza as a special reward.

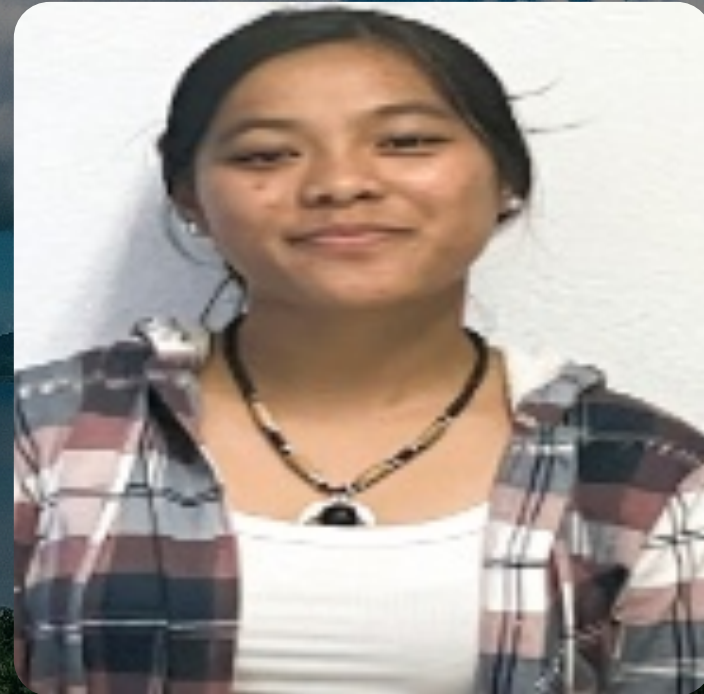
Everyone was happily singing together and were feeling proud of what they have achieved. This fun gathering helped them relax and get their minds and hearts ready for the next semester.

7. SBA involve in the planning committee for the Board of Regent meeting to be held in June 9 - 12, 2026.

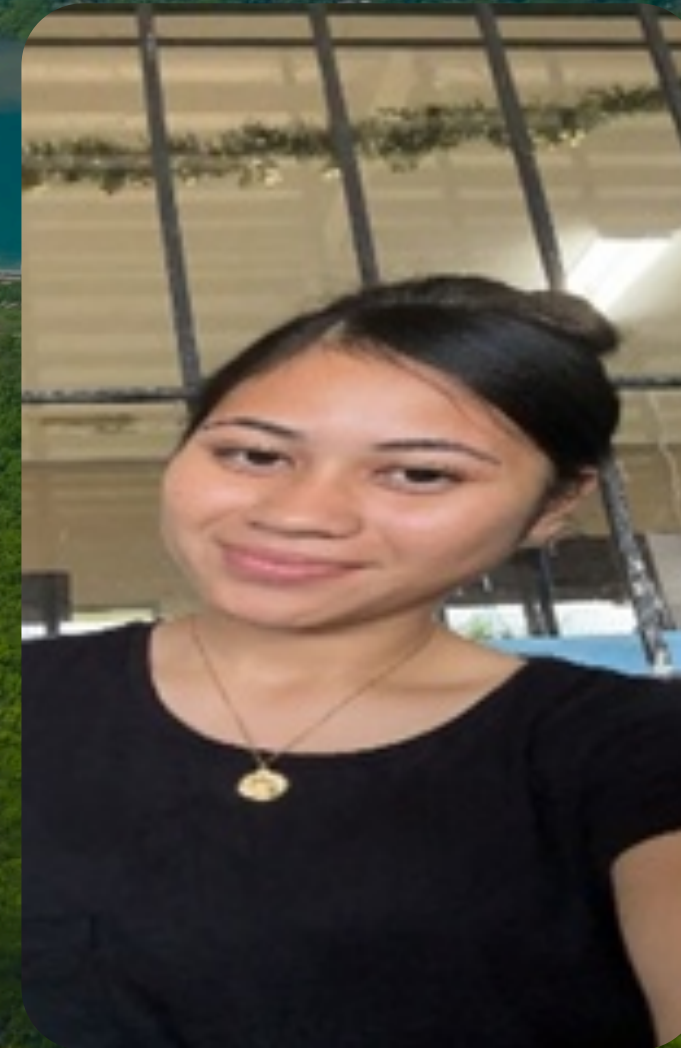

- NEED FOR ADDITIONAL WORK-STUDY OPPORTUNITIES FOR STUDENTS.
- CONCERNS REGARDING BOOKSTORE SERVICES, AVAILABILITY OF SUPPLIES, AND ACCESS TO EDUCATIONAL MATERIALS.

## **CAFETERIA OR EATING HUT (KOSRAE CAMPUS)**

- LACK OF A CAFETERIA OR DESIGNATED EATING AREA FOR STUDENTS.
- REQUEST FOR A CAMPUS DINING FACILITY OR COVERED EATING HUT TO PROVIDE A COMFORTABLE SPACE FOR MEALS.

## **CAMPUS OUTDOOR COURT**

- NEED FOR AN OUTDOOR COURT FOR SPORT ACTIVITIES.
