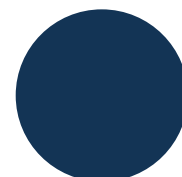
Operational capacity remains constrained by 10 continuing vacancies and one approved maintenance position; late reprogramming also compressed the procurement window.



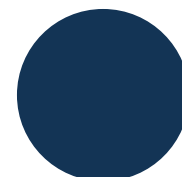
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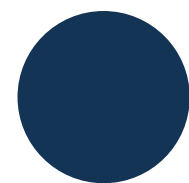


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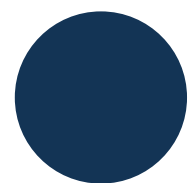

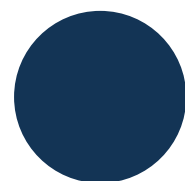
- Shipboard Training on MV H2

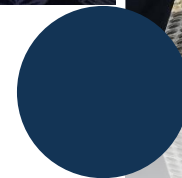
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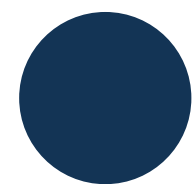
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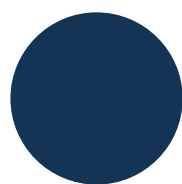
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GOAL 1. Promote quality teaching, learning, and curriculum development across all COM-FSM campuses.

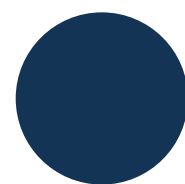
- Approved 33 course outlines system-wide, keeping pace with the college's curriculum-modernization timeline
- Pilot 8-week compressed schedules for MS 096/MS 099, moving students to degree-level math a semester sooner-Fall 2026
- ACE program shifted fully online with strong mentor support across all five campuses
- Student pass rates held strong: 81–89% face-to-face, 83–86% online, well above the 70% standard
- Met with Professor Ryan Ko (Queensland University) and USP/DOJ representatives on a DFAT-funded Pacific digital integration study



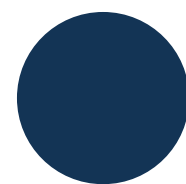
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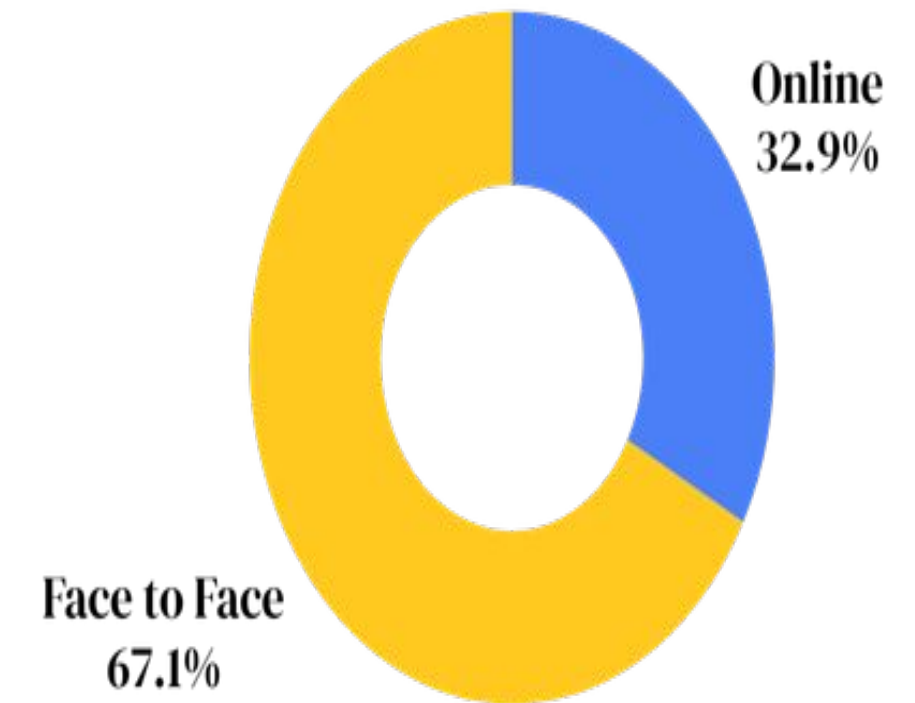
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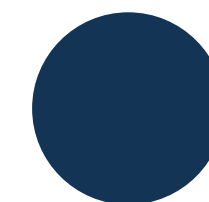

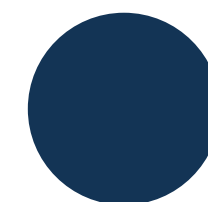
- Added 12 new library materials in June, including Marine Phytoplankton of the Western Pacific; welcomed 2 copies of Pohnpeian Verse in July
 - Received 69 print books from Midwest since October, with 2 more on the way
 - Converted the former Entrepreneurship Center into a group study room;
 - Partnered with Library of Accessible Media for Pennsylvanians LAMP toward hosting the Pacific Island Association of Libraries, Archives, and Museums (PIALA) 2026 Conference; cross-trained CTEC and National LRC for improved services and efficiency

- Prepped for Fall 2026: cleaned lab computers and set up 8 study tables and 23 seats system-wide



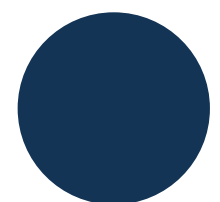
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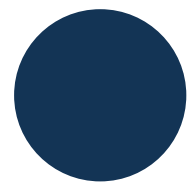

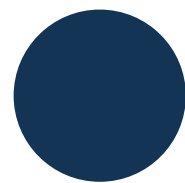
- Delivered 37 professional development trainings on a \$45,000 PD budget; 100% full-time faculty participation in retreats
- Sent 4 faculty, the Instructional Coordinator, Educational Technologist, and an IT consultant to MoodleMoot Philippines; Prof. Mayleen Wichep presented
- Hosted the Fall 2026 Faculty Workshop (Aug 3–4): Day 1 administrative briefings, Day 2 program-assessment presentations and 10 group scenario exercises
- Explored AI policy (BP 8940), Edpuzzle integration into moodle, and VR headsets for Nursing instruction



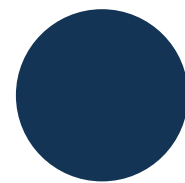
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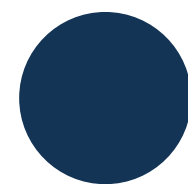


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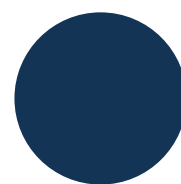


GOAL 4. Establish a new or strengthen existing internal and external stakeholder collaboration to enhance educational opportunities and outcomes

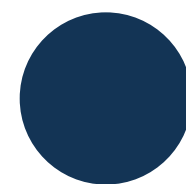
- Completed Yap R&D Electrical Training (15), State Finance Technical Accounting (20), and PUC Apprenticeship (8) programs
- Graduated 13 students from the 150-hour Electrical Systems Certificate; provided venue and training 13 NORMA observer trainees with FMI
- POWWOW advising reached 62% attendance and 104 awards; College Fair drew 333 students from 16 schools and 62 agencies
- TRIO recorded 83 student successes with 98–100% FAFSA completion
- Resumed APIC study abroad after a hiatus — Valedictorian Ms. Makayle'a Kia'ni Charley completed a 4-week session at Sophia University, Tokyo
- Graduation of FSM-FMI 9 Class 4 Cadets from FMI. well-attended by leaders at all levels of government and traditional chiefs in Yap. President Simina presented the keynote address.



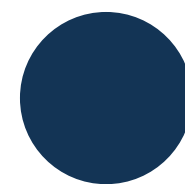
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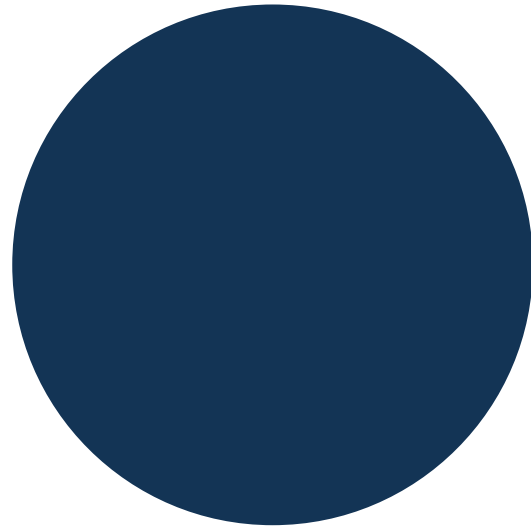

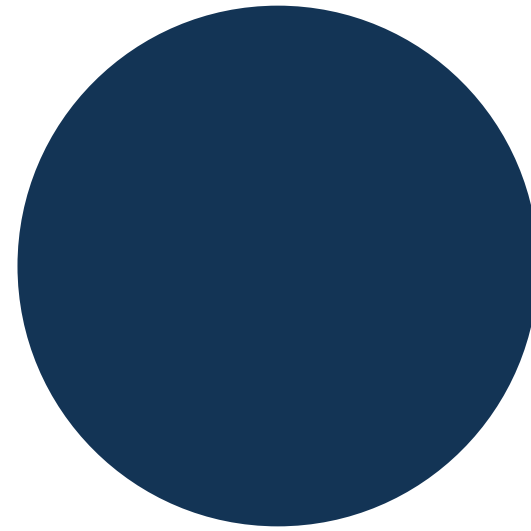
- Mapped 100% of Instructional Affairs objectives and VPIA budget to Institutional KPIs and Strategic Goals
 - Held system-wide IA Assessment meetings (June 29–July 3) covering Power BI, Excel reporting, and enrollment workflows
- Assessment at the program level:
- Identified 13 below-target outcomes this cycle, all in Spring 2026; Business Admin and Nursing Assistant have filed findings
 - Teacher Prep Elementary and Pre-Teacher Prep still need findings filed for their below-target outcomes
 - Nursing (AS), Hospitality & Tourism, and prerequisite courses remain near 100% — documenting what's working
 - Developing a shared strategy for addressing absenteeism, the most common theme across program findings →



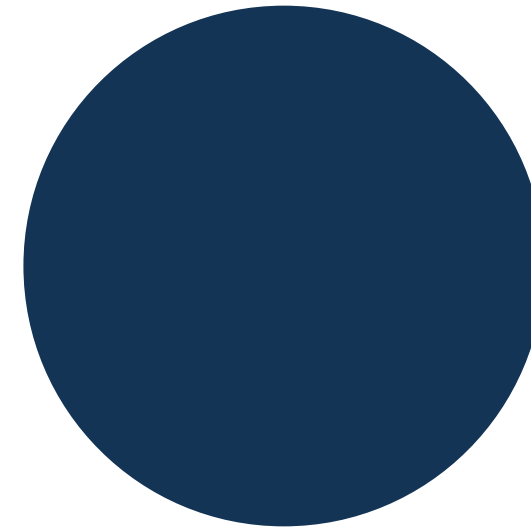
